The 2019-2020 School Year Has Begun at Wishram School


From the Superintendent:

Over the summer, we've worked very hard with the architects and engineers in the designing phase of rebuilding the entire north wall of Wishram School and expanding our current Career and Technical (CTE) facility about 400 sq. ft. If everything works out, we still plan to go out to bid on both of these projects in February. Then, the contractors should be able to start work in May. The Wishram School Career and Technical Education (CTE) program is up and running again. It is so exciting seeing Wishram Students once again using their brains and their hands in the process of building items. The students are constantly talking about the things they are going to build in their shop classes. Thank you for passing the levy which not only provided us with a much-needed counselor but also allowed us to get our CTE program back up and running. From the Classroom


Mr. Weaver, 6-12 Social Studies



We have started the year strong in the Social Studies department. This year with addition of 6th grade to the middle school level I get the opportunity to teach World History. We have started at the beginning of mankind and will move forward studying many ancient civilizations including the Greeks, Romans, early China and others. The 8th grade is studying early American History up to the Civil War era. 9th grade studies Civics the first semester and Pacific Northwest History the second semester. 11th grade studies American History focusing on the 20th century, and of course our Seniors are learning Current World Problems. We have started strong and I am looking forward to having a great year working with our students.

Mrs. Roberts, 6-12 English/Language Arts

It's another great year for reading, writing, and thinking in the ELA department! This year we are fortunate not only to continue offering our Bridge to College English class to upperclassmen who are preparing to take on college-level English (either after graduation or via online Running Start through Clark College offered here at Wishram School), but we have added a Bridge to College English Prep course for 10th and 11th graders as well. This course uses a similarly-structured curriculum as the BtCE course, and will help prepare students for success on the statewide standardized assessments as well as for the increased rigor of the BtCE course that they



will encounter next year. For more information on the Bridge to College courses and curriculum, I encourage you to visit bridgetocollegecourses.org. The 6/7 and 8/9 ELA classes are both following a curriculum centered around novel studies. Currently, the 6/7 class is reading Among the Hidden by Margaret Peterson Haddix, while the 8/9 class is reading S.E. Hinton's classic The Outsiders. With our expanded schedule in the secondary due to the addition to Mr. DeVoe's CTE courses, I am able to offer two ELA elective classes this year: ELA Explorations, an 8th grade reading and writing workshop, and Inquiry/Project-Based Learning, a semester-long course for 11th and 12th graders where students have the opportunity to complete a project based on their learning interests. It continues to be my pleasure and privilege to work with the bright, talented, funny, and kind students of Wishram - thank you, parents/guardians, for sharing them with us!

CEP
