## Superintendent

- To date, students have turned in 1,166 missing assignments. Overall, our individual student grades are proficient, and assignments are coming in regularly.
- 2. Our Fall SBAC testing results have arrived, and the breakdown is as follows:
  - a. ELA- 53% Proficient/Distinguished
  - b. Math- 26% Proficient/Distinguished
  - c. Science 76% Proficient/Distinguished
    - i. When compared to our district goals of 50% proficiency in each subject tested, we are certainly headed in the right direction for our Spring SBAC testing.
- 3. Parent teacher conferences were held on October 28<sup>th</sup>, we had a great turnout. In total 66% of our secondary students and families showed up for open conferences and met with each teacher. Students carried passports from class to class and had teachers provide signatures to indicate that they had met with the student and parent to discuss current performance. The students then provided the passports to the office for a chance to win a \$25 Amazon gift card.

### **ELEMENTARY**

# 1/2 grade

Our class has been working hard on mastering their phonics, spelling, and letters. We have many new readers emerging from our group and the older readers that are excelling at their art have been helping their classmates. Math has been a bit more challenging this year for the first graders. They are working hard right now on different strategies of subtraction and addition up to 20. The kindergartners are working on counting to 100 and mastering their number writing. We have been using the science curriculum Mystery Doug and really enjoying it. The investigations have been fun and interesting! This group of students is very inquisitive and ready to learn all about their world and community. We have studied the Earth and some of the planets that make up our solar system and will continue to go deeper as the year progresses.

## 2nd /3rd grade

We have arrived in a groove in our class. The reading curriculum finally came about a month ago. It involves lots of writing and reading and very interesting non-fiction pieces, all the students are stepping up and not shying away from the work. Their reading is becoming more fluent, the vocabulary is rich, and the science and historical information is extremely engaging to them. They are working very hard.

In math, the third graders are learning how to add 3-digit numbers with a variety of strategies. It is definitely "new math," for me. The 2nd graders are working on similar math concepts but with smaller numbers. We also are introducing multiplication to everyone. Everyone one of the students is becoming very proficient at cursive writing and we have been doing lots of sewing to prepare for the special lunch table decorations.

They are all working so hard and will enjoy the five days off from school, but if I had to guess this group will be happy to return next Monday.

4th and 5t grades are doing great. We continue to work on long division, multi-digit multiplication, volume, and estimating- with some extremely large numbers. Mr. Cooper and Mrs. Ringer are happy with the progress students are making.

We are reading Historical Texts and learning to summarize by finding the main idea and then 2 or more supporting details. Students are also learning to sight text evidence in their summaries, Students are plugging along with their spelling through morphemes. It is making a huge difference not only in their spelling, but also in their reading fluency!

Students spent their art time creating decorations for the tables at the Fall Feast and are looking forward to the prospect of a Live Winter Program via Facebook Live.

If we have to change a light bulb or a ballast in a light we have to do this off a 2' wide catwalk in the attic. One misstep either direction and you are falling 24' to the gymnasium floor. And in the summer, it's 100 + degrees in the attic and it can take 30 or more minutes to change out a ballast. I reached out to United Rentals and they gave me what I think is some good deals on some used ones they have. I'm asking the board to approve up to \$6,500 for the purchase of a used scissor lift.
